# **Learning to Live with Diabetes**

Being diagnosed with diabetes doesn't mean you can't live a happy, healthy life. Managing diabetes affects all aspects of your life. Over time, you will learn about diabetes and how to better self manage. The goal is to be as healthy as you can be, enjoy life and prevent complications.

#### REFERRALS

Referrals are accepted from:

- YOU: if you have diabetes simply call us. You do not need to be referred by your doctor or health care provider.
- ANY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER: doctor, nurse, Pharmacist, etc.

### **PROGRAM SERVICES**

Our Registered Nurse(s) and Dietitian are **Certified Diabetes Educators** and provide services to **adults** with:

Type 1 or Type 2 Diabetes
Pregnancy planning
Gestational Diabetes
Insulin Pump

We offer services to Elliot Lake, Spanish and Massey.

You will receive an assessment and *quality diabetes teaching*, ongoing support and help in all areas of diabetes, to make day-to-day decision about your diabetes control.

**NOTE:** you will be given a **token** to exit the paid parking lot.

## **Appointments**

Come directly to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor at SJGHEL to access the **Diabetes Office.** You **do not need** to check in at Admitting (you will be pre-registered the day of your appointment).

We greatly appreciate <u>48 hours notice</u> for appointment cancellations or changes to scheduled appointments.

#### ONE ON ONE APPOINTMENTS

- Your <u>first</u> one-on-one appointment may be with the Registered Nurse <u>or</u> the Registered Dietitian. Please plan 1 hour for this appointment.
- Follow up appointments are usually scheduled every 3
  to 6 months, or at times yearly. In-person, in clinic
  follow up appointments are preferred; can be
  coordinated via telephone if deemed suitable. Please
  plan 30 to 45 minutes for these appointments.
- You may bring a family member/support person with you to your appointment.
- When you are involved, you can make better decisions about your treatment plan. Be prepared:
  - Bring your list of medications; vitamins.
  - Bring your blood sugar monitor (glucometer).
  - Ensure your lab tests are done before the appointment (unless advised otherwise).
  - Ask questions and talk about your concerns.

Your diabetes treatment plan is *customized* to <u>your</u> needs. *You* are the most important member of your diabetes team. We will work closely with your healthcare provider in Ontario. If you do not have one, we will assist you.
